ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 86-1. - Fishing and crabbing prohibited at certain locations.

It shall be unlawful to fish or crab in Trent River from the sidewalk, along the waterfront extending from the east line of Metcalf Street, westwardly to the west line of Eden Street.

Sec. 86-26. - Park designated.

The parking, boat launching and docking facilities located at Union Point in the city shall be known as the Cedric M. Boyd Park at Union Point.

Sec. 86-27. - Operation of boats in the vicinity of launching ramp.

The ramps which have been constructed in the several parks for the purpose of launching small craft, together with catwalks, shall be used only for the launching of boats and for their loading, and to that end, no boat shall be docked or moored within the launching area for servicing, refueling or any purpose not required as a direct part of launching or loading.

Sec. 86-28. - Temporary mooring at docking facilities.

Only temporary mooring of small craft shall be permitted at the docks which have been constructed at the several parks. No such craft, whether locally owned or visiting, shall use the docking facilities for permanent mooring. Commercial fishing vessels may not use the docking facilities at all. "Temporary mooring" is defined as mooring during daylight hours for no more than four hours at a time. Overnight mooring at the docks is prohibited.

Sec. 86-29. - Parking vehicles.

Parking areas for motor vehicles and trailers shall be designated by signs and by line markings, and no parking of vehicles and trailers shall be permitted in any other areas.

Sec. 86-30. - Overnight camping.

No overnight camping shall be permitted ashore at any waterfront parks in tents, trailers or self-contained camper units unless authorized in writing by the parks and recreation department.

Sec. 86-31. - Swimming from launching and docking facilities.

No person shall swim from the launching and docking facilities located in the several parks owned by the city.

Sec. 86-32. - Notice of provisions of this article.

Appropriate signs shall be posted at the Cedric M. Boyd Park at Union Point, at Glenburnie Park, and at Lawson Creek Park, to the end that persons utilizing the launching and/or docking facilities will be aware of the provisions contained in this article.
